Tech Tip: Mish, Mash. What I meant to say was Mesh. A quality mesh is extremely important in successful printing. Mesh elongation (relaxation) is better controlled and stable with a quality weave. Also, using the proper mesh count and thread micron allows ink to properly flow and achieve the desired ink deposit. Quality mesh will also last longer. Lastly, don't forget to always, always degrease mesh before coating with emulsion.
